- Formed in 2022, following the restructure of the University from six Colleges to three Faculties.
- We are a research-intensive Faculty with staff and doctoral students conducting world leading research across our nine departments.
- We are committed to delivering the highest calibre research and practice, encouraging a vibrant, collaborative and interdisciplinary culture based around both strategic and critical areas of expertise in the Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences.
- We're also building an international community for our students, who come from more than 120 countries, to establish a globally excellent and inclusive faculty.



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- Global Engagement is central to the vision of Faculty of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences. We are proud to work with a wide range of stakeholders, including world-leading universities and alumni to expand our global reach and impact.
- We have an outstanding record of winning external funding (more than £70 million pounds of funding income received between REF 2014 and REF 2021) and building partnerships. Our Institutes, centres, networks and groups provide structure and support, promoting interdisciplinary collaboration, knowledge exchange and impact.
- The Faculty hosts the University Societies and Cultures Institute (SCI) as well as the Institute for Arab and Islamic Studies (IAIS), which are key structures for promoting interdisciplinary within the Faculty and across others.





What is HASS?

- Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences is the study of human behaviour and interaction across social, cultural, environmental, economic and political contexts.
- HASS looks at both the past and the present, locally and globally, personally and culturally to consider, address and plan for future challenges.
- It plays an important role in harnessing students' curiosity and imagination about the world they live in, and empowers them to actively shape their lives and the world around them.
- Students learn how to question; think critically; problem solve; communicate effectively across multiple platforms, and to people from different backgrounds and experiences; make decisions; and adapt to change – all skills highly valued by employers.
- HASS at Exeter is expanding its curriculum to become a more interdisciplinary subject, collaborating with the other Faculties on course delivery, as well as with external partners locally, nationally and internationally.
- Our work operates against the backdrop of the University's Strategy 2030 focusing on equality and inclusion, health, and sustainability.

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MA Social Media Management

- Will provide students with specialist knowledge of social media in business contexts
- Encompasses areas such as brand strategy, brand and reputation management, crisis communication and user behaviour
- Students will also gain technical proficiency - how to measure and create engagement and how to budget to create impact through engine optimisation and understanding of AI.
- This will be a unique MA programme among leading UK universities insofar as it focuses on the management of social media by taking the two elements as integral to each other rather than distinct areas

MA Social Media and Digital Marketing

- Students will gain advanced knowledge of, and develop advanced skills in, digital marketing, management, with a particular focus on social media and e-commerce initiatives
- Students will learn how organisations in the public, commercial, and third sectors use social media and digital platforms to brand themselves and use promotional activities to drive up sales and other forms of user and customer engagement
- Focus will be placed on precision tracking of interactions, writing and crafting of promotional materials, conceptualising and streamlining e-commerce activities, and critically engaging with techniques such as search engine optimisation (SEO).
- Students will engage in specialist content creation and other relevant practical skills used in industry.

LLM Law and Technology

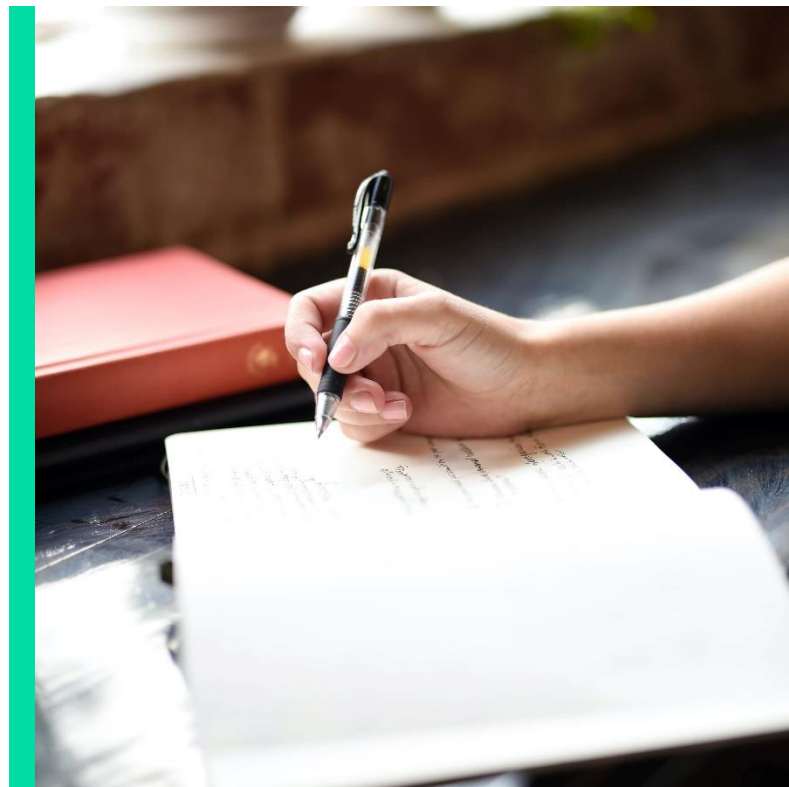
- This program has a robust and varied technology scope that goes beyond a general ICT to explore technology in context

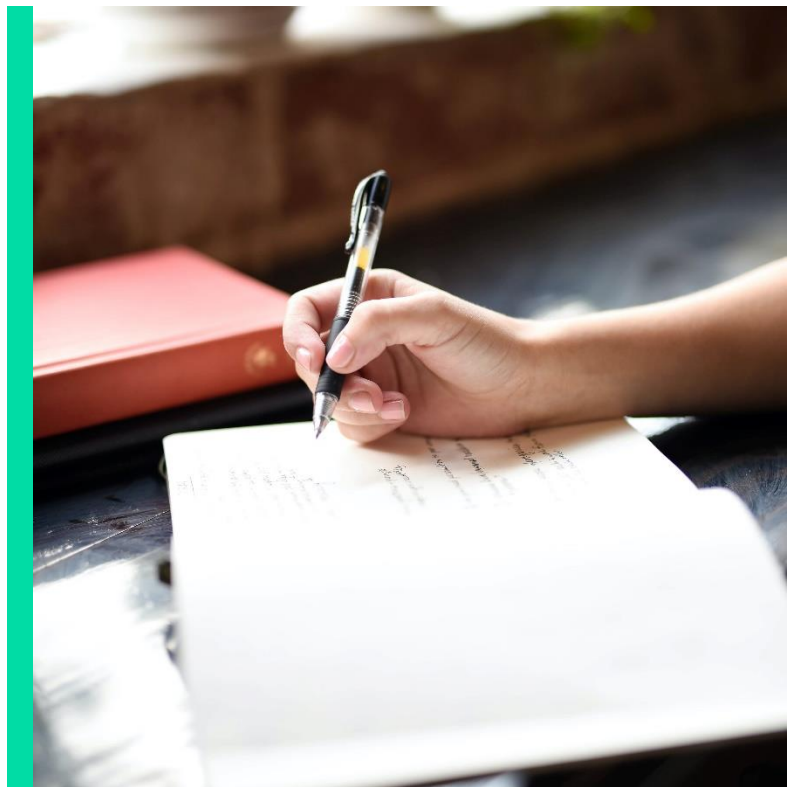
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MA Media and Communications

- Media and Communications is a broad interdisciplinary field, bridging elements of theory and practice, and sitting at the intersection of cultural studies, sociology, social anthropology and business studies
- Our MA has been designed with flexibility in mind, providing students with the opportunity to customise their degree depending on their career goals or interests
- It provides students with the advanced level foundation for the next generation of communications professionals, media researchers and educators
- Gain hands-on experience and training within our unique and world-leading research facilities, such as the Digital Humanities Lab and the Bill Douglas Cinema Museum
- Research-inspired learning through unique modules led by staff research expertise, including video games and social media management-focused modules

MSc Global Security Studies

- In the context of today's challenges and opportunities there is a high demand for students with a expertise in global security combined with analytical and problem solving abilities
- This MSc provides training in the major issues in global security combined with a targeted focus on key vocational skills needed to analyse contemporary challenges and opportunities in the policy world
- It will allow students to focus on particular issues and areas and to develop their knowledge and skills for future careers in security and strategy, including within governmental and non-governmental organisations at the domestic and international levels
- The MSc includes a core, intensive three-day practice-focused module that provides employability specific practice-oriented training for students wishing to pursue a career in security and strategy
- Students will develop confidence through interaction and exposure to staff in our Strategy and Security Institute, which is recognised the world over as one of Europe's leading Institutes for new thinking on Strategy and Security

- The Digital Humanities Lab, a £1.2 million investment on our Streatham Campus, further enriches both undergraduate and postgraduate teaching and research with its state-of-the-art equipment, spaces and training.
- The Special Collections Archive contains collections of unique and rare materials, which include archives, manuscripts, and rare books. Our holdings comprise more than 470 archive and manuscript collections and more than 50,000 rare books
- The Bill Douglas Cinema Museum holds a wide-ranging collection of more than 70,000 film related artefacts and is the largest research archive in any British University. The collection is available for all students to use as a research and study resource, giving students a highly distinctive and valuable experience of studying and researching film using primary materials, documents and artefacts.

Facilities

- The Lasok Law Library, located in the Forum on the Streatham Campus (Exeter), holds in excess of 40,000 volumes and is open 24 hours a day. In addition to United Kingdom, Commonwealth and some United States holdings, the collection is particularly strong in European Union, French and German law.
- We also offer access to Lexis, Westlaw and Eur-lex, and other online legal databases.
- At both our Streatham Campus in Exeter and Penryn Campus in Cornwall, we have dedicated spaces for mooting and mock trials, giving our students an authentic legal education.

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Overview

- Art History & Visual Culture at Exeter is an exciting area of study which explores both the history of art and more recent ideas of the visual – extending the analysis of visual forms from the historical right through to areas of modern and contemporary practice.
- Modern Languages and Cultures at Exeter is one of the most dynamic and forward-looking departments in the UK. Our research, which has a solid interdisciplinary component, comprises diverse areas such as translation, cultural, literary and film studies, history and linguistics, including Intercultural Communication.
- Our department comprises seven major language areas: Chinese (Mandarin), French, German, Italian, Portuguese, Russian, and Spanish, and through optional modules students can also expand their studies into other languages and cultures.
- As part of an Undergraduate degree in Modern Languages and Cultures, students spend a Year Abroad studying at a partner institution across the world, working or, in some countries, on a British Council assistantship.

Reflecting on Educational Practices (EFP918)

- This is an optional Masters module that teaches students skills which can be helpful in finding employment after graduation.
- The module involves two parts: a series of lectures and seminars focusing on critical reflection, experiential learning and professional development within education; and a set of educational experiences.
- The educational experience of practice may either: be based on curated digital online activities; take place physically in a place of education; or occur in a virtual place of education.
- It is not expected that experiences will take place in the formal school setting. Students are encouraged to think about the variety of settings where education might occur and to consider experiences which will challenge your existing assumptions, perspectives and skill sets.

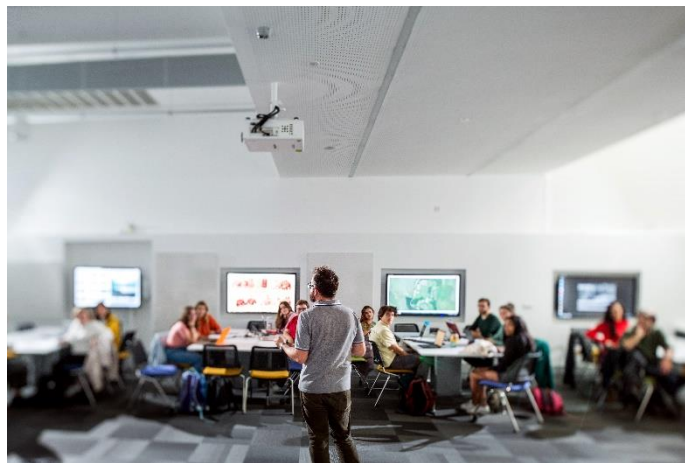

Exeter Q-Step Centre

- Exeter is one of only 15 universities to host a Q-step Centre.
- Building on the University's core disciplines of Sociology, Criminology, Politics, and International Relations, Exeter Q-Step brings together a range of activities related to training as well as curriculum development in quantitative methods.
- The Centre has recruited academics for the delivery of undergraduate courses focused on endowing students with quantitative literacy and applied data analysis skills, so it offers challenging, exciting and career-enhancing programmes.
- Through its dedicated academic staff and accompanying support programme, Q-Step provides training in industry-standard tools and personal feedback. This has enabled the Centre to forge links with industry-leading employers through guaranteed work experience placements, which are funded via work experience bursaries.
- The Q-Step Centre can currently be found in the Clayden Building, boasting a state of the art Computational Lab providing individual PCs for up to 30 students.
